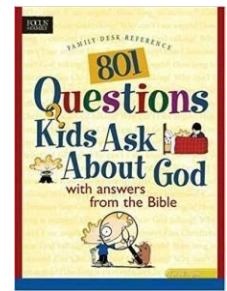




Why was Jesus born in a stinky stable?
